

Summary of Significant Career Events

Retired from Active Duty

7/97

- 1. Received three Sikorsky Winged "S" for at-sea rescues.
- 2. In first squadron, in combat in Vietnam, qualified as Attack Helicopter Aircraft Commander in 4 months Fire Team Leader, one month later.
- 3. Rescued Personnel Exchange Program (PEP) in UK for USN WASP Helicopter exchange. Successfully completed RAG (703 Squadron) after two previous USN exchange candidates failed to complete. Received Outstanding Student Award Huntsman Trophy. Due to success, was assigned as Flight Commander, HMS Leander first US pilot to be given this command. Subsequently won two Lott Awards for ASW excellence and OPREADY percent (98.6%) on 7 month deployment.
- Upon graduating from Naval War College in June 1980, received the Navy League Outstanding Student Award for both academic excellence and community involvement.
- As CO, HS-17, on board USS Coral Sea during Phase III ORE, 1985, only squadron in Air Wing 13 to successfully complete NWI/NTPI: inspector's comments included "flawless admin/flawless loading".
- 6. While COMNAVBASE, Guantanamo Bay, received the first ever Meritorious Unit Award for managing the collection, housing, feeding, medical aid and repatrition of 37,000 Haitian migrants, along with maintaining the morale, safety and positive work environment of all 7,700 base residents. Additionally provided unparalleled support to 2,200 JTF members assigned TAD

- to manage the Haitian migrants installation awarded Joint Meritorious Unit Award for efforts.
- 7. While PERS (2a) at BUPERS, engineered and orchestrated installation of upgraded IT suite that had been approved for PERS 2 but languishing in storage for 18 months all completed within 6 months of arrival at BUPERS.
- Upon arrival at COMNAVBASEJAX, discovered similar IT Suite upgrades approved but not installed and commenced one year upgrade for entire staff/building. Result was vastly improved IT connectivity and utilization.
- Pollowing retirement, entered civilian world as Branch Manager, Jacksonville Navy Federal Union; COO, Lanahan Lumber Company; COO, Logical Business Solutions. Left workforce in 2005. Remained on boards of numerous non-profits in Jacksonville. Most proud of involvement and contributions to the North Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Currently completing 21st year on Executive Board as the National Eagle Scout Association, Council Committee Chair. Previously served as VP Programs and VP Operations. Received Silver Beaver Award, was Course Director for Wood Badge, am a James E. West Fellow and in 2013 was awarded the National Eagle Scout Association Outstanding Eagle Scout Award.
- Married to the former Carol Anne Nuesse of Wauwatosa, WI (47 yrs), have two grown children (William and Kelly) and 6 grandchildren.
