# **Summary of Significant Career Events**

- (1) A Plankowner of the VFA-131 Wildcats, planned the highly successful SEAD mission that supported the A-6 Intruder strikes into Beninah and Benghazi Libya in 1986. Also flew multiple combat flights in the Gulf of Sidra including intercepting and escorting of Libyan Migs and a mission vs the SA-5 site at Sirt. Subsequently assisted Strike University at Fallon with redefining Air Wing training for preplanned SEAD Harm support of combat operations.
- (2) Graduated Top Gun in 1986 as one the first cruise experienced pilots to fly the FA-18 in the Power Projection syllabus.
- (3) Selected to attend Test Pilot School, earned the USNTPS "Outstanding Student Award."
- (4) Selected as "Test Pilot of the Year" at Strike Aircraft Test Directorate for his work in Aircraft Carrier Suitability Testing. As a Test Pilot, flew in 31 different types of aircraft and conducted special test flights to resolve FA-18 "settle of the cat" concerns from the fleet, along with other envelope expanding flight tests related to aircraft carrier catapults and landings, ordnance release testing and night vision goggles. This included the first carrier launches and recoveries from the USS *Abraham Lincoln*. Flew envelope expanding fights related to Aircraft Carrier Suitability, ordnance carriage/ release and night vision goggles in the FA-18
- (5) One the first East Coast fleet pilots to attain low level night vision qualification.
- (6) While a Department Head in VFA-37, awarded the Strike Fighter Wing's "Michael Longhardt Leadership Award."
- (7) Volunteered to deploy for 5 months on the ground in Sarajevo, Bosnia in the midst of the siege of city by the Bosnian Serbs to be the first Navy NATO Air Advisor to the UNPROFOR commander. During this 5-month tour, coordinated with the CAOC in Vicenza to strike targets in response to UN violations and ultimately IDed and selected ground targets for the Deliberate Force Air Strikes that ended with the signing of the Dayton Peace Accord.
- (8) As Commander of VFA-131 that included Combat Operations in Iraq, led the squadron to winning the Battle E and Top Hook honors for the deployment.
- (9) Earned Individual "Top Ten" in Carrier Landings on USS *Coral Sea*, USS *John F Kennedy* and USS *John C Stennis*.
- (10) As Commander of USS *Carl Vinson* on an around the world deployment successfully teamed with the Air Wing to fly months of combat operations is support of OIF and OEF. The ship earned Naval Air Pacific Battle E and multiple other honors and awards including the first CVN to fly both the EAWS and ESWS Pennants, indicating every eligible enlist-

ed member of the crew had earned their warfare qualification.

- (11) Post-deployment, led the transition of USS *Carl Vinson* into the Shipyard for RCOH and began what was to be the first ever on-time and on Budget completion of a CVN midlife overhaul.
- (12) Spearheaded the standup of the "Carrier Readiness Team" that was modeled after Naval Aviation Enterprise. This effort began the standardization of Aircraft Carrier configuration from communication and landing aids to offensive and defense weapons and systems to the minimum requirements for air wing spaces. These efforts resulted in selection as "Tailhooker of the Year" for 2006.
- (13) While Commander of Carrier Strike Group 5 in Japan, led innovative use of "Ready for Tasking" (RFT) for the Carrier Strike Groups that tied mandatory required Air Wing combat training to readiness for the China Fight. This set the groundwork for what would ultimately require Fallon Air Wing Training for CSG 5 squadrons in Japan.
- (14) Remained Carrier Qualified in the FA-18 during tour as a CVN Commander and also as Strike Group Commander in Japan.
- (15) CENTCOM J3 during a period that included the drawdown from 101,000 combat troops in Iraq to zero and during the surge from 60,000 to 93,000+ combat troops in Afghanistan while also supporting the Task Forces fight against AQAP in Yemen.
- (16) Led the introduction of the use of USMC Tactical aviation into Yemen in the fight against AQAP.
- (17) Integral to the writing of 3 guiding strategies for the Navy and the Department of Defense including the first Tri-Service Maritime Strategy ...From the Sea and later its 2 subsequent major revisions. Also, the Navy lead for the writing of the QDR, the guiding strategy for DOD. Each of these strategies highlighted and emphasized the strategic role of Naval Aviation in support of our National Defense. Teamed with the USMC to ensure that USN/USMC aviation were cemented in Joint doctrine for the foreseeable future.
- (18) Led the French Aircraft Carrier Strike Group *Charles De Gaulle* to their first ever Command of a U.S. led Task Force in combat operations. This included the integration of French Carrier Aviation with U.S. Carrier Aviation for several months of strikes on ISIS positions in Iraq and Syria. These efforts led to being awarded the "French Legion of Honor".
- (19) In response to Houthis attacks on U.S. ships in the Red Sea led operations that launched the first retaliatory strikes on Houthi positions in Yemen.
- (20) In response to proliferation of chemical weapons oversaw the launch of 60+ TLAMs and into Syria from both the Gulf and the Mediterranean.
