

- (1) JO tour in VFA-86 / Pilot of the year. As Nugget, Top 10 during Northern Wedding deployment.
- (2) Operation Desert Storm. DFC w/ Combat V
- (3) FLAG LT USCINCPAC
- (4) Legislative Fellow for SEN John McCain
- (5) During VFA-37 CO tour, we received the Golden Wrench award for best Maintenance department in CSFWL
- (6) During Operation Desert Fox, as Strike Lead/Mission Commander, integrated two B-1 aircraft into the strike plan for their inaugural debut in combat
- (7) During VFA-106 CO tour, only FRS to meet pilot training requirements.
- (8) While serving as CAG (CVW-14), we were the first CVW to deploy and operate with Remotely Operated Video Enhanced Receiver (ROVER). This system allowed JTACS to receive real-time imagery significantly improving recon / target ID for CAS operations.
- (9) During maiden deployment aboard USS *RONALD REAGAN* (JAN'06), and due to the transition of Super Hornets, we deployed with four single seat Strike Fighter Squadrons (2 x F/A-18C and 2 x F/A-18E).
