Summary of Significant Career Events

- 1. Started flying out of High School, earning Private Pilot, Commercial Pilot, Instrument Certificate and Flight Instructor Certificate. If I had not been working at McDonald's, I would have starved.
- 2. Graduated Top 10% of TBS Class and earned Regular Commission.
- 3. March 1981, Certified as Air Combat Tactics Instructor by Knute Knutson, youngest Marine pilot to date.
- 4. Oct 81, Top Gun Graduate, one of the youngest Marine pilots to date, selected to lead the Final Class Graduation Strike.
- 5. During various WestPac deployments, selected for "mini-exchange" with JASDF F4-EJ Squadron at Tsuki Air Base, USAF 8th TFS at Osan Air Base (F-16) and USAF 20th TFS, Clark Air Base (F-4E)
- 6. Graduated from WTI/ Class 1-83. Invited to return to MAWTS-1 as instructor.
- 7. MAWTS-1 F-4 Instructor, taught High Threat CAS, Low Altitude Tactics, SAM Counter Tactics, Threat Air-Air Tactics, FW VS Helo Tactics, and Instructor Lead for 10 air-borne events. F-4 Instructor Lead for "new" Senior Officer ACTI Refresher Course. Flew A-7K with Tucson ANG applying newly developed three-dimensional low altitude tactics for the F-4. Selected to be USMC First Low Altitude Tactics Standardization Officer. Proposed (but not approved) a revolutionary Low Altitude ACM Program for F-4.
- 8. Assigned to lead newly created Adversary Tactics Program in support of stand up of VMFT 401. (Knute Knutson was first VMFT 401 CO) Wrote the T&R Syllabus for the USMC F-21 Kfir Adversary Program. Wrote the USMC Adversary Tactics Instructor Pilot Program. Selected in one of first groups of USMC pilots to qualify in the F-21A Kfir. First MAWTS-1 pilot to augment the Adversary Program, simultaneously qualified in the F-4 J/S/RF-4B, F-21A, TA-4J.

- 9. In addition to F-4 Instructor duties, also served as "Red Air Coordinator" for six WTI classes, developed a "nom de guerre" of Mohammed Abdul Kareem Urass of the Socialist Coalition of United Muslims (SCUM), coordinating and flying many hundreds of Red Air Sorties against WTI Students in support of the WTI Training Objectives.
- 10. Nominated as USMC Pilot of the Year as OpsO for VMFAT 101 in June 1992.
- 11. Selected to serve as MAGTF Staff Training Program Aviation SME in 1993. Taught Strategic and Operational Aviation concepts to MEF Staffs. Participated in developing aviation portion of new USMC Five Step Planning Process.
- 12. First to complete and graduate from the "new" online USMC Command and Staff Program. Later selected as one of the first "on site" instructors for the newly developed distant learning USMC Command and Staff Program.
- 13. Selected as Commanding Officer of VMFT 401 in 1998 and tasked to re-energize the USMC Adversary Program. Certified as F-5 ATI, LATI, Division Lead and Large-Scale Exercise Lead. Revitalized and upgraded the Adversary Tactics Instructor Program. Introduced three-dimensional maneuvering into the F-5 Low Altitude Tactics Program. Initiated F-5 support of MV-22 OT&E and use of F-5 to provide sorely needed SIM-CAS sorties in support of FAC training at MCB 29 Palms. Initiated the Adversary Cross Country Program to support Fleet squadrons, created the "Adversary pilot mini-exchange" program with pilots from VMFAT 101 to broaden IP experience. Planned, executed, and personally participated in 21 deployments/dets in support of Fleet squadrons.
- 14. Left scratch marks on the highway all the way from Yuma to the Pentagon when selected by LtGen McCorkle to work at HQMC/ APW and then afterwards on the Joint Staff.
- 15. Set land speed record driving from the Pentagon to Miramar once my "career enhancing" Pentagon tour was over.
- 16. Selected in 2003 as Commanding Officer of MAG-11 the Marine Corps' Oldest and Finest Air Group. Tasked to reconstitute the Group and "catch up" with delayed maintenance after a successful and lengthy deployment in support of OIF and ensure that every squadron met their maintenance and operational readiness goals. Initiated Group wide monthly Large-Scale Exercises focusing on opposed Hight Threat CAS and Opposed Long Range Strike missions. Deployed forward to Al Asad in support of 3rd MAW during Operation Phantom Fury, flying 30 combat missions.
- 17. Exceeded 5000 accident-free flight hours.

18. Retired in 2006. On my last working day, I flew my last Hornet flight, in a VMFA 323 jet, against my old friends at VMFT 401. The flight was a 1 versus 2, the hard way (with a wild card thrown in because everyone wanted a piece of Pearl). The flight ended at Miramar with a 500 knot break and a half flaps flare.
